On the basis of this concept, the 'Pudhu Vaazhvu Project', an innovative scheme is being implemented in India, with the Funding assistance of the World Bank with a specific goal of improving the livelihood of women, vulture and poorest families, physically challenged, mentally suffered, chronically ill, Tribal people in the villages of our country, by creating employment opportunites, marketing skills, and communication skill. This scheme is completely designed for the poorest women sectors in the villages, apart from the poorest families, physicallydisabled, chronically ill-affected and tribal completely by the World Bank, specifically in concentrating to the above targeted groups not at all benefitted by any schemes.

The PVP is implementing in Madurai District from the year 2011, covering four blocks like Vadipatti, T.Kallupatti, Kallikudi and Sedapatti, under the Administrative control of the District Collector with skilled administrative staff. The State and Central Government implemented several schemes like Integreated Rural Development Programme (IRDP), Development of Women and Children in Rural Area (DWACRA), Training Rural Youth for Self Employment

(TRYSEM), Prime Minister Grama Swaraj Yojana (PMGSY), Indra Awaz Yozana (IAY), Tamil Nadu State Rural Livelihood Mission (TNSRLM), and National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) throughout the Nations with adequate allocation of Funds. NGO in 1985, based on the Recommendations of the G.V.K. Rao Committee observed that the tools of Non-Governmental organizations, felt necessary for the successful implementations of the rural schemes as mediator between the Government Officials and rural poorest people with Information Education Communication (IEC) methods. The SHGs also play an important role in the upliftment of livelihood by getting funds from governments, are formed by the rural people, administered by the members and planned by the same members of the SHG and finally get beneficiaries creating small business to big entrepreneurs for the members like a small basic unit of a democracy. The United Nations in its various declarations has made it abundantly that men and women should be given equalities in all fields. It became the global concept.

Formation of PVP

The pudhu vaazhvu project is a special scheme, entirely funded by the World Bank for the economically upliftment of the targeted group of rural women, physically challenged, mentally retorted and chronic diseases suffering sectors which are not at all benefitted by any scheme is that there are no agencies or mediators between the targeted group and the implemented team. This PVP is started from the year 2005 as a first phase in Tamil Nadu with allocation of fund of Rs.717 crores, covering 70 Blocks in 16 Districts, and subsequently extended in 2011 on a second phase with allocation of fund of Rs.950 crores covering 50 blocks in 10 district.

PVP in Madurai District

The total number of blocks in Madurai District is 13 namely, Melur, Kottampatti, Alanganallur, Vadipatti, Madurai East. Madurai West, Sedapatti, Tirumangalam, Kallikudi, T.Kallupatti, Usilampatti, Chellampatti and Thiruparankundram. Out of these 13 blocks, PVP has been implemented only in 4 Blocks namely Kallikudi, T.Kallupatti, Sedapatti and vadipatti.


